PEI BioAlliance

A private-sector led, not-for-profit umbrella organization, the PEI BioAlliance represents Prince Edward Island's bioscience sector, including over 60 bioscience companies and several research institutions. Emergence

Emergence is Atlantic Canada's virtual bioscience business incubator dedicated to assisting start-ups and growth-stage companies in efficiently bringing their products and services to market. They are working with over 50 companies and offer customized access to business, technical, scientific and regulatory support services.

Canadian Alliance for Skills & Training in Life Sciences (CASTL)

As of spring 2021, there are 2,200 people working in various PEI biotech companies. CASTL was created by the PEI BioAlliance in collaboration with partners in academia, industry, and government to meet the growing demand for more skilled and qualified workers in the Life Sciences sector on PEI.
